<b>CEA # 2</b>	Young Drivers
<b>Strategy # 3</b>	Improve parental accountability in young driver training and behavior
<b>Targets</b>	Parents of young drivers in 16 to 20 year old age groups
<b>Description</b>	Enact legislation to make parents more accountable for actions by young drivers
<b>Actions</b>	<p><b>Step 1 – Review present VSA applicable to this issue</b></p> <p><b>Step 2 – Determine recommendations to Administration drafts persons to mitigate the issue</b></p> <p><b>Step 3 – Monitor Legislative progress</b></p>
<b>Time Frame</b>	By the end of the 2009 Legislative session
<b>Output</b>	A law making parents more accountable for their offspring's driver training and behavior.
<b>Data Needed</b>	Documentation of parent supervised driving training; documentation of parental approval for holding a graduated driver's license; and documentation of parent attendance at mandatory orientation sessions.
<b>Data Collection (how, by whom)</b>	Schools will have documentation of parent supervised driving experience and attendance at mandatory orientation sessions. DMV has data for parental approval to hold a graduated driver's license.
<b>Performance Measure</b>	More parents become involved in the training of young drivers and have a greater influence in proper behavior by young drivers.
<b>Funding</b>	To be determined.
